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

The Scientific Consensus and Emission Trajectories

Material: Slides Timing: 5 mins Purpose of Activity: Making learners aware of the scientific consensus behind the severity of the climate crisis. Trainers are unlikely to encounter climate change denial but it's still very important to emphasise the credibility of the science.

The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC)

The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) is the United Nations body for assessing the science related to climate change.

Through the IPCC, thousands of experts from around the world synthesise the most recent developments in climate science, adaptation, vulnerability, mitigation and synthesise it into major 'assessment' reports every 5–7 years.

This infographic summarises the 2014 report on 'Impacts, Adaptation, and Vulnerability'. This is a massive [possibly the biggest ever] scientific project of its kind. The project is peer reviewed.


195 governments across the globe have accepted and approved the final summary showing that the days of climate denial and scepticism are long gone.

The Scientific Consensus

It's important to highlight that there has never been this much CO₂ in the atmosphere over this time period.

The personnel in this example are interchangeable depending upon the audience.

Another review of 11,602 peer-reviewed articles on "dimate change" and "global warming" published in the first 7 months of 2019 found that 100% of these agree that global warming is caused by humans.

Module 6

Innovation in the NHS

Material: Slide deck, Activity PDF (Innovation reading cards), breakout rooms, whiteboard function OR pen and paper.

Timing: 35 minutes

Purpose of Activity: To explore areas where learners can focus on carbon reduction across the NHS, including carbon hotspots and case study examples.

Preparation: Read over the innovation cards and ensure you understand the feedback slides

Innovation cards


This activity will allow learners to explore NHS carbon hotspots, looking at where intervention is needed and how this is being achieved within the NHS, using real life case studies. You have 35 minutes to complete this activity.

Pre-allocation of breakout rooms is advised for this activity but is not essential as discussion outside of the learner's job role is also beneficial. You can choose to pre-allocate learners to breakout rooms based on the topics that suit them best, but this requires knowledge of their roles before the session begins.

Activity instructions

The reading cards within the activity pack focus different topics where the NHS is looking to reduce emissions. These cards outline; 1. The challenge, 2. What we need to be doing and 3. What's already being done / case studies. These cards should inspire learners to think about what they can be doing in their job role to reduce emissions in these areas.


There are 5 different topics, it is ideal if your group is large enough to cover all 5. If you are delivering to a smaller training group, please select the topics that are most relevant to the group and focus on these. If there is time you should use the feedback slides to run through the highlights from the topics the breakout rooms haven't covered to ensure all the details get explained.




Engaging the workforce
